RE: 2021 Janata Award: GDLA Nomination - Mask Up For Justice!

Dear Selection Committee:

As GDLA President, it is my privilege to nominate the Georgia Defense Lawyers Association for the 2021 Rudolph A. Janata Award. We believe Mask Up For Justice! (MUFJ), our joint project with the plaintiff's bar (Georgia Trial Lawyers Association/GTLA), is an innovative, unique program that not only contributed to the goals and objectives of the organized defense bar, but also our state's justice system as a whole.

Recognizing that courts did not have the liquidity in their budgets – given the unforeseen nature of the global pandemic – to purchase enough equipment to ensure juror, witness, and other trial participant safety, GDLA and GTLA set aside their differences and joined forces to create Mask Up For Justice! Georgia's courthouses shut down in early March due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but we knew the need would eventually arise for personal protective equipment (PPE) when court proceedings resumed. We also knew the civil docket would be low priority when the courthouse doors reopened, but still felt compelled as officers of the court to get the wheels of justice moving as quickly as possible.

MUFJ officially kicked off in September 2020 (see press release on pages 3-4). We organized a joint committee of GDLA and GTLA members to manage the project through weekly Zoom calls. Leading that effort was our Executive Director, Jennifer Ward, who worked alongside GTLA member Laura Voght to field requests from courthouses, including packaging PPE themselves and shipping via FedEx. We created a website at <u>www.maskupforjustice.com</u> and established a Facebook page (see page 5) and Twitter account, all which Jennifer and Laura regularly updated.

MUFJ was featured in two newspaper articles in the *Daily Report*, Georgia's American Lawyer Media publication (see pages 6-9), which helped get the word out to the legal community and, more importantly, to court personnel who would benefit from receiving PPE. We also were featured in DRI's *The Voice* (see page 10). GTLA and GDLA included articles in their publications and websites – the latter with links to the MUFJ website. GDLA and GTLA members were charged with emailing judges with whom they had a relationship to explain the program and see how we could help. GDLA and GTLA listservs helped spread the word internally (see samples, page 11-12).

Court personnel were able to request personal protective equipment (PPE) via the website. Jennifer would then follow up with specific questions related to their request. One, in particular, from a court administrator in rural South Georgia explained the dire need for a program like MUFJ:

We are requesting masks and PPE to be used in the Wilcox Superior Court for criminal jury trials. There is a financial need for assistance in Wilcox County. According to the U.S. Census Bureau, the per capita yearly income in Wilcox County is merely \$14,829.00, with 30.8% of the population living in poverty. Seventeen percent of Wilcox County residents have no health insurance. With merely 50% of Wilcox County residents having internet service in their homes, we must have in person trials. It would be a great asset to this rural county and its citizens to have masks and face shields provided by GTLA and GDLA.

Together with GTLA, we raised more than \$53,000.00 to purchase and supply/ship masks (standard CDC-compliant surgical masks, face shields, and ClearMasks<sup>™</sup>) to Georgia's courthouse facilities to help them resume jury trials and operate safely during the pandemic. We asked lawyers, law firms, law firm personnel, voluntary bar associations, and both GDLA and GTLA sponsors to contribute.

We also received a \$79,500.00 grant from the State Bar of Georgia's Commission on Continuing Lawyer Competency (CCLC) to supplement our fundraising. Our grant application explained how MUFJ's objective and purpose fit squarely under the purview of the CCLC:

Lawyer competency is enhanced 'on the job' during a trial as each and every one brings its own challenges and opportunities to gain knowledge as a court case unfolds. Having had the courthouse doors closed since March has limited this form of experiential training and sharpening of trial skills. We also believe the sooner trial lawyers can get back to court, the better our society will be as a result. The wheels of justice rely heavily on the work of capable trial lawyers whether in a criminal or civil setting.

Since MUFJ's inception, we have shipped almost 30,000 masks to courthouses statewide (see chart on pages13-48). Supreme Court of Georgia Chief Justice Harold Melton applauded our team effort saying, "Your support for safe court proceedings sends a very important message at a very critical time." Georgia Court of Appeals Judge Ken Hodges added, "We appreciate your joint efforts to keep everyone safe." You can read more letters from judges and courthouse personnel on pages 49-58.

While the courthouse doors have reopened, we are still supplying courts with PPE as they try to return to a sense of operational normalcy. We are incredibly proud, and truly humbled, to have teamed up with the other side of the "v." to give back to the justice system in such a tangible and meaningful way. We also believe it ultimately was a service to both of our memberships by helping dispense of criminal matters in a quicker fashion, thereby freeing up the dockets to reach the civil calendars. And given the work (or world!) stoppage that crippled so many groups and so much of life, we were honored to still be active in a unique and much needed way.

We appreciate the Selection Committee's review of our nomination and supporting materials.

#### GTLA and GDLA Announce Mask Up for Justice! Joint Fundraising Project to Help Courthouses Safely Reopen

(September 21, 2020) The Georgia Trial Lawyers Association (GTLA) and Georgia Defense Lawyers Association (GDLA) have set aside their differences, crossed party lines, and joined forces to establish Mask Up for Justice! This charitable effort will raise funds to provide supplies, including masks and personal protective equipment (PPE), for Georgia's courthouse facilities with the goal of helping them resume jury trials and operate safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The project was the brainchild of GTLA member Laura Voght of Cash Krugler & Fredericks, Atlanta, whose sister is a front-line medical worker and subsequently contracted COVID-19. "Watching my sister and her colleagues struggle to obtain masks and sufficient PPE resonated with me in relation to my own profession as a trial lawyer, when I considered how the justice system would be impacted as courts move toward re-opening and resuming jury trials," she said. Ms. Voght brought the idea to GTLA President Lyle Warshauer of Warshauer Law Group, Vinings, who embraced it and suggested getting "the other side" (aka GDLA) on board. GTLA formed a Mask Up for Justice! Committee, headed by Ms. Voght and Robert Glass of Glass & Robson, Atlanta, who also chairs GTLA's Community Outreach Committee.

"Since the courts system touches both sides of the 'v.,' it seemed logical to team up with GDLA to raise funds to support the restart of in-person hearings and jury trials," explained Ms. Warshauer. GDLA President Jeff Ward of Drew Eckl & Farnham, Brunswick, added, "Our side was ready and willing to be involved, since it is incumbent on all parties to litigation to ensure the wheels of justice keep turning. It's in our mission."

#### Plaintiff. Defense Bars Unite for Courthouse Mask Fundraiser

• The state's plaintiffs and defense bars have united for a fundraiser to provide masks and other protective gear to Georgia courthouses, as the resumption of jury trials draws closer. The project, Mask Up for Justice!, was the brainchild of Laura Voght of Cash Krugler & Fredericks, a Georgia Trial Lawyers Association member whose sister is a front-line medical worker and contracted COVID-19

Voght said her sister and sister's colleagues' difficulty procuring masks and adequate personal protective equipment "resonated with me in relation to my own profession as a trial lawyer when I considered how the justice system would be impacted as courts move toward re-opening and resuming jury trials."

GTLA president Lyle Warshauer of Warshauer Law Group embraced the fundraising idea and asked the Georgia Defense Lawyers Association to join in. GDLA quickly agreed. said its president. Jeff Ward of Drew Eckl & Earnham "It is incumbent on all parties to litigation to ensure the wheels of justice keep turning," he said.

The funds raised through Mask Up for Justice! will be used to provide masks and other PPE for anyone using the courthouses, including jurors, courthouse employees and lawyers, Ward said.

In Forsyth County, Chief Superior Court Judge Jeff Bagley has scheduled an Oct. 7 virtual calendar call to schedule live jury criminal trials beginning Nov. 2.

The chief justice's Judiciary Pandemic Task Force released new guidelines last week for inperson jury trials that conform to state health and safety protocols, including mask-wearing, plexiglass barriers and social distancina.

Asked about a target amount that GTLA and GDLA aim to raise, Ward replied, "Aspirationally, I hope that amongst the ranks of both GTLA and GDLA we could at least approach \$100.000.

# As Georgia Courthouses Reopen Amid COVID-19 Spike, Trial Lawyers Organize Mask Up Fundraiser

As courts other states deal with the challenges of resuming trials, Georgia lawyers are looking to reduce spread by making more masks available. The effort has raised \$50,000 since September.

As COVID-19 cases resurge in Georgia and nationally, while courts around the country struggle to restart backlogged jury trials, budget-constrained Georgia courthouses' need for masks has taken on new urgency.

Now that the state's 159 superior courts are starting to schedule in-person jury trials, a joint fundraising effort from Georgia's plaintiffs and defense bars to equip them with masks has kicked into high gear.

Mask Up For Justice! (https://www.maskupforjustice.com/), a joint initiative by the Georgia Trial Lawyers Association and Georgia Defense Lawyers Association, has raised \$50,000 since its September launch (https://www.law.com/dailyreportonline/2020/09/29/plaintiffs-and-defense-bars-unite-for-courthouse-mask-

fundraiser/)—and it needs additional funds quickly as organizers brace for an influx of new mask orders, said Laura Voght of plaintiffs firm Cash Krugler Fredericks, who is leading the effort.

So far, the group has received mask requests from five counties—Fulton, DeKalb, Fayette, Hall and Chattahoochee —plus the Cordele Judicial Circuit, Voght said. Most have come in over the past three weeks since the organizers added an order form to the Mask Up for Justice! website (https://www.maskupforjustice.com/). Court administrators were hearing that money for masks was available, but weren't sure how to get in touch, she explained.

The Georgia court reopenings come even as judges in New York and Texas are suspending jury trials because of infections. New York's state courts on Friday halted any new jury trials (https://www.law.com/newyorklawjournal/2020/11/13/as-coronavirus-cases-climb-nys-court-system-putsbrakes-on-new-jury-trials/) and grand juries because of the state's climbing COVID-19 infection numbers. In Texas a federal judge suspended a jury trial (https://www.law.com/dailyreportonline/2020/11/12/breakinglawyer-juror-test-positive-for-covid-19-prompting-judge-to-pause-federal-trial/) on Thursday after multiple participants, including a lawyer and juror, tested positive for COVID-19. That was the 20th trial for the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas after resuming jury trials in June.

Georgia had its first federal jury trial (https://www.law.com/dailyreportonline/2020/10/21/clear-masksjuggling-jurors-mark-columbus-first-federal-trial-in-covid-19-era/) in October without incident after a criminal defendant asked for a speedy trial, despite a general moratorium on jury trials until January for the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Georgia.

The status of jury trials at the state court level is fluid right now, Voght said, after Georgia Supreme Court Chief Justice Harold Melton told an emergency meeting

(https://www.law.com/dailyreportonline/2020/10/30/melton-nothing-is-irreversible-in-order-lifting-jury-trialsuspension/) of the state Judicial Council on Oct. 26 that it is up to the chief judge of each courthouse to decide when it is safe to reopen. That followed a mid-October order from Melton allowing courts to again hold in-person jury trials after a seven-month suspension.

Georgia has 159 counties, second only to Texas in number, and each has its own superior court, ranging from Atlanta's very busy urban ones in Fulton and DeKalb counties, to much less populated ones in rural counties.

Mask Up for Justice!'s organizers are prioritizing courthouse mask requests by when their jury trials start. The first order it filled was from Hall County, which asked for 200 clear masks for trials starting this month, Voght said.

"A lot of court administrators feel the clear masks are important so participants can see facial expressions in trial proceedings," she added.

Other requests have come in from the Cordele Judicial Circuit, which has scheduled its first jury trial for Dec. 14, followed by Fayette County for Jan. 4, and Fulton and Chattahoochee counties, which have both scheduled their first jury trials for Jan. 11, Voght said.

The group is ordering about 3,000 surgical and 1,000 clear masks for the Fulton County Courthouse, which is the busiest in the state. Court administrators can issue clear masks to trial participants and use the cheaper surgical masks for courthouse sta and others.  $\bar{A}$ 

Clear masks cost about \$2.75 apiece for a bulk order, while surgical masks are 50 cents apiece, Voght said. She tested several brands of clear masks before fulfilling the Hall County order with the Clear Mask brand. "Some were good, but others did not fit my face at all, so I'm glad I screened them before ordering thousands that wouldn't fit anyone," she said.

Voght said some people have asked her why courts must depend on charity for masks. The pandemic has already strained court budgets with technology costs for remote hearings or, for many, because they fall under a county operating budget that's already incurred unplanned expenses such as PPE for jail inmates.

For the courts, "This is a very pressing need that they don't have the money for," she said.

The court administrator for the Cordele Judicial Circuit in rural South Georgia, for instance, asked for masks and face shields for criminal jury trials in Wilcox County Superior Court.

Wilcox is one of the poorest counties in the state with a per capita annual income of just under \$15,000. Only half of the county's residents have home internet service, said court administrator Amy Bryant in her request, so "we must have in-person trials."

Probate courts also need masks, Voght said, adding that just this week at least four Cobb County Probate Court clerks (https://www.law.com/dailyreportonline/2020/11/11/four-cobb-probate-court-clerks-contract-covid-19-another-case-suspected/) came down with COVID-19. Certain proceedings for these courts often must be in person, and they are busy—in part because COVID-19 has caused so many deaths and thus estates to be probated.

The top donors to the mask fund so far are King & Spalding and plaintiffs firm Fried Goldberg at \$5,000, followed by Alston & Bird and plaintis rms Beasley Allen and Ken Nugent at \$1,000 apiece. ĀĀ

Many individuals—paralegals, secretaries and lawyers alike—have also made donations, Voght said. "Every bit counts. Just one \$50 donation can provide a fair amount of surgical face masks and prevent multiple people from being exposed to COVID-19."

Mask Up for Justice!'s organizers are procuring the masks for the courthouses, but the group is operating under the auspices of the State Bar of Georgia Foundation. The bar foundation is receiving donations made via Mask Up for Justice!'s website (https://www.maskupforjustice.com/), which are tax-deductible, and using the funds to pay for the masks.
